Our Vision and Mission

Dhruv Global School is guided by its Vision — Creating Global Leaders with Yogic Values — and its Mission: To nurture every child with care and purpose, expanding our family and impact across the world. This Uniform Policy has been developed in service of that Vision and Mission. A dignified, disciplined and consistent appearance reflects the values of self-respect, humility and discipline that are central to a yogic way of life, and prepares our students to carry themselves with the confidence and integrity expected of global leaders.

Rationale

The purpose of the DGS uniform is to ensure that every student presents a neat, dignified and professional appearance at all times, reflecting pride in belonging to the Dhruv Global School community. Personal presentation matters, and a high standard is expected of all students, both within the school campus and in the wider community. We look to parents for their continued support and cooperation in this regard, as our students represent the school at all times — while travelling to and from school, during school activities, and on school trips. The uniform is a visible symbol of identity within our community and fosters a shared sense of pride, belonging and respect for the learning environment.

General Uniform Guidelines

Full and correct uniform must be worn at all times while at school and while travelling to and from DGS, including after school, during co-curricular activities, and on school trips, unless otherwise instructed by a member of staff. Full uniform is also required at Parent-Teacher Consultations and other formal school events.

- Shirts and blouses should be of an appropriate, well-fitted size, and boys' shirts must be tucked in at the waist at all times.
- Only the official DGS jumper, pullover or sweater may be worn; when not in use, it should not be tied around the waist.
- Trousers, skirts and shirt sleeves should not be rolled up.
- A belt is mandatory as part of the uniform.
- Shoes should be polished and well maintained at all times.
- Students are asked to change out of DGS uniform into casual clothing before attending social events after the school day.
- Visible body modifications, such as tattoos and piercings, are not permitted. Henna application is acceptable only for religious or cultural occasions.
- All uniform items must conform to this policy and be purchased through the school's authorised supplier.
- Parents are kindly requested to clearly label all uniform items, bags, lunchboxes, water bottles and other personal belongings, to support the prompt return of any lost items.
- Only **black colour** winter jackets / jumpers / sweaters are allowed in the school premises.

Where a student does not meet the uniform requirements set out in this policy, they will be asked to rectify this immediately. If this is not possible, the student may be required to remain at home until the school's expectations can be met. In such instances, the student will not be permitted to sit in class or attend any sessions until the uniform matter is resolved, and parents will be contacted immediately to either bring the correct uniform to school or take the student home to resolve the uniform issue.



Hairstyles and Grooming

Girls

Hair should be tied back neatly, fully off the face. Simple hair accessories — such as an Alice band, hairband, clips, slides or elastic bands — are acceptable provided they are plain and in white or black colours. Make-up and nail polish are not permitted for any student.

Boys

Hair must be kept well off the collar, ears and face, and no shorter than a number 2 barber cut; shaved heads are not acceptable. Coloured gel, wax or mousse should not be used when styling, and exaggerated styles should be avoided. Boys are expected to be clean-shaven as part of a neat, professional appearance. Parents wishing for a boy to be exempted from shaving for religious reasons are asked to contact the relevant Learning Manager directly. Neatly groomed facial hair is permitted for boys once they turn 16 years old.

All Students

Hair should be of a natural colour and should not be dyed a bright, obvious or unnatural shade. Hairstyles should remain neat and modest at all times. Where a hairstyle does not meet these requirements, the student will be asked to amend it immediately; if this is not possible, the student may be required to remain at home until an acceptable standard has been restored. In such cases, parents will be contacted immediately and the student will be asked to be taken home, returning to school only once the hairstyle is in line with this policy.

Jewellery

- Wearing a wrist watch is discouraged for safety reasons. Smart watches are not permitted on school premises at any time.
- Small studs may be worn in the earlobes and must be removed for Physical Education. No other piercings are permitted.
- Jewellery of religious significance may be worn only with prior written approval from DGS, following a formal request from parents.

Uniform Guidelines by School Level

For the current academic year, Dhruv Global School offers schooling from Pre-KG through to Grade 8. The uniform requirements for each stage are set out below.

Kindergarten (Pre-KG to KG2)

Boys

A belt is compulsory as part of the regular uniform across all grade levels.



Footwear

Shoes must be plain, black, leather school shoes. Trainers and sports-style shoes — including those made by Adidas, Nike, Puma, Vans, Slazenger, Asics, Converse, LaCoste, Ellesse, New Balance, Reebok, Toms and similar brands — do not meet this requirement, as these companies do not produce approved school shoes, regardless of colour or style.

We appreciate that students may express a preference for popular trainer styles; however, we kindly ask parents to support the school's standard by purchasing only proper black leather school shoes. Students found in unsuitable footwear will be asked to replace it, even if it has only recently been purchased.



Skirt Length and Modesty

- Skirt length must cover the knees.
- Attire must always be modest and in keeping with UAE cultural expectations.

Casual Dress Days

- Clothing must be modest, neat and appropriate for a school setting.
- Tight, sheer, transparent or revealing garments are not permitted.
- Ripped jeans, sleeveless tops or vests, low-cut or deep necklines, and backless garments are not permitted.
- UAE laws and cultural values must be respected at all times.

Students who do not adhere to this policy on casual dress days will be asked to leave the campus immediately. Where the student is not accompanied by a parent or guardian, parents will be contacted without delay.

Physical Education (PE) and Swimming

- Students must wear the prescribed PE uniform on PE and Yoga days.
- Hats and water bottles must be brought for outdoor PE sessions.
- Cleats and football shoes are not permitted unless specifically instructed by PE staff.
- All jewellery must be removed for PE and swimming.

Shared Responsibilities

Parents

- Ensure their child wears the correct uniform each day.
- Maintain appropriate standards of hygiene and grooming.
- Inform the school of any medical exemptions that may apply.
- Ensure their child carries the school ID every day.
- If the ID card is lost or damaged, parents must inform the school immediately and request a replacement at their own cost.

Students

- Take personal responsibility for wearing the uniform correctly.
- Avoid the misuse of uniform items.
- Wear school ID all times while on the school premises.

Staff (including the PE Team)

- Monitor student appearance on a daily basis.
- Record and report instances of uniform non-compliance in line with the school timetable.

Uniform concerns are addressed through the following escalation process:

1. First occurrence — a warning issued by the Class Teacher, communicated to parents by email.
2. Second occurrence — a written warning issued by the Section Head.
3. Third occurrence — a meeting between the parent and the Section Head.



4. Continued non-compliance — detention or community service, with the Principal informed.
5. Further non-compliance — suspension of up to three days; the matter may be reported to KHDA where necessary.
6. Chronic non-compliance — the school may deny re-registration for the following academic year.

Even at the first occurrence, the student will be pulled out of class or the session, and parents will be asked either to bring the correct uniform to school so the student can change and resume their lessons, or to take the student home.

Additional Restrictions

- Personal digital devices may not be brought to school without prior written approval.
- Mobile phones and smart watches are not permitted on school premises at any time.
- Skates, scooters and skateboards are not permitted on campus.
- The school cannot be held responsible for the loss of personal belongings.

Closing Statement

The Dhruv Global School Uniform Policy reflects our shared commitment to discipline, equality and school pride. In line with our Vision of Creating Global Leaders with Yogic Values and our Mission to nurture every child with care and purpose, we ask all members of our school family — students, parents and staff — to uphold these standards with consistency and mutual respect, so that every child grows in confidence, self-respect and readiness to lead.
